Often this event draws the one who is watching to see the reality of Christ, and what we proclaim about Him. An inmate on the phone



lashed out in anger as he could not hear because of my greeting, commotion, and the singing. As we finished he slammed down the receiver, went to his nearby bunk, and was very angry. Some men tried to console him. As we walked out of the pod he ran up to me, and said, "I'm sorry for the way I acted." I understood his reaction, we'd interrupted his call. The following Monday he put in a kite to be seen. Once again he apologized and wanted to talk. He admitted to ongoing anger issues. A current girlfriend had enough of his anger, and didn't want to talk with him anymore. His

ex-wife cut him off for the same reasons. I listened to his heart, and how anger had overtaken his life. I shared about the Lord who desires to build a relationship with him, and bring changes in his life. The next day he kited again, apologized, and asked me to come see him. This time the Holy Spirit had prepared him to respond, and He gave his heart to Christ! Your investment in lives like his makes such a huge difference!

Marisol (Mari) Douglas - Another Changed Life!



My family attended a Catholic Church when I was 10 or 11. For almost my whole life I believed in a higher power, something greater than me, but I never knew about God. I never knew the whole story about Jesus. I just knew about baby Jesus. We went sometimes 2 or 3 times a week. I did communion and catechism. Beginning at the age of 8 I was molested by a family member many years. It was dismissed so I had many feelings of shame, fear, and the loss of feeling safe

amongst my family. At the age of 11 I started drinking with friends and running the streets after sneaking out. At 15 I had my first sexual encounter.

I started using marijuana when I was 16, or 17, and I continued to use marijuana until meth crept into my life at the age of 22. It grabbed and

held on to me. I got pregnant and even then still used. My mother died when I was 3 months pregnant. She was 41 and truly my best friend. DHS got involved in my life after I had my daughter. I was struggling to stay sober by myself and care for my daughter too. I couldn't do it. I almost lost custody of my daughter, and chose to go to a treatment facility out of town where I could have her with me. I did 4 months of treatment away from my old life. These were new positive good people. I came home and relocated to Ankeny, and was able to stay clean for about 9 years. Then my daughter's dad and I split up, and I started dating someone I thought I knew, but things went crazy. Eventually the person was sent to prison but I had already lost 2 homes.

I was living with this person's dad by the end of the situation. One day I came home from work and his dad was smoking crystal meth with people I happened to know from my past. It wasn't long until I was using again and lost my job too. I started running the streets. I was now in my 30s.

One day I got pulled over for a suspended license. I had drugs, money, and paraphernalia on me, so I went to prison. While waiting for my sentencing at Polk County Jail I met Chapi Denise. I went to her Bible study class and it was a life changing moment for me. Chapi Denise spoke about God like the Father I had never known. It was the strength in her love and words that made me want to know who this Father was. She gave me a Bible and told me to read it. I'd never read the Bible. That day at the Polk County Jail Ministry my heart found Who it was missing. Jesus! I started reading my Bible, but it was hard
